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Planting Stock Access Program Application

The planting stock access program is funded by the Lincoln University of Missouri and is managed by the Midwest Forest Farming Coalition. This program is designed to increase the availability of forest botanical planting stock in the Midwestern US particularly for new and underserved forest farmers. The first round of the program (2025) will award grants to Missouri-based farmers to order up to \$1000 worth of planting stock through the MWFFC. Awardees will fill out an order form which will be fulfilled by the MWFFC, and planting stock will be distributed to them.
